ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission requirements are the minimum qualifications you need before you can be selected for admission to a course of study.

As an international student attempting one of the following qualifications, you will apply for admission through UAC International and will generally be selected on the basis of your performance in these studies (that is, your ATAR or equivalent):

- an Australian Year 12 qualification (either offshore or in Australia)
- an International Baccalaureate
- a New Zealand National Certificate of Educational Achievement Level 3.

When assessing your application, ANU may take any or all of your qualifications or attempts at study into account.

Note: That entry levels required by international students may be different to the level required by domestic students.

Additional selection criteria

In addition to achieving the standard of performance required for admission, for certain courses you must also satisfy any additional selection criteria. These criteria may include portfolio, interview, audition, questionnaire or test and are taken into account either instead of, or in conjunction with, your ATAR or equivalent.

If you are undertaking your Year 12 studies offshore and are applying to a course that has additional selection criteria which you will find difficult to meet, contact the ANU Admissions Office.

International applicants applying for admission on the basis of qualifications other than those listed above must apply directly to the University, not through UAC International. For details, visit http://students.anu.edu.au/apply_online.asp

STUDENTS UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE

Before you are granted a student visa, the Australian Government must be satisfied that you have appropriate accommodation, support and general welfare arrangements in place for the period that you will be under 18 years of age whilst in Australia.

ANU does not accept responsibility for welfare arrangements for international students who are under 18 years of age unless you turn 18 within the first six weeks of semester. Note: If you are offered a place at ANU you must pay a deposit before we will issue you an electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) for use in your student-visa application process.

The deposit of A\$7,500 will contribute to your tuition fee and the applicable Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) insurance premium.
