ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

For admission to a postgraduate coursework program you would normally be expected to have a Bachelor degree or three-year Diploma from a recognised tertiary institution in an appropriate discipline. You may also need relevant professional work experience.

In exceptional cases an applicant may be admitted as a candidate for a specific course if the applicant submits other evidence of academic and/or professional experience.

Overseas qualifications and English proficiency
