ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

For admission to a postgraduate coursework program you will normally be expected to have a Bachelor degree or three-year diploma from a recognised tertiary institution in an appropriate discipline. You may also need relevant professional work experience.

In exceptional cases an applicant may be admitted as a candidate for a specific course if the applicant submits other evidence of academic and/or professional experience.

Course entry requirements vary for individual courses.

When submitting your application it is important to use the appropriate course code if applying for courses offered by distance education.

Overseas qualifications and English proficiency

If you hold overseas qualifications from countries where English is not the standard language of instruction, you must provide evidence of English language proficiency. Refer to the English language proficiency table on the UAC's postgraduate website at www.uac.edu.au/postgraduate/faq/elp.shtml for information about tests and qualifications accepted by the University as proof of proficiency in English.
