ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Graduate diplomas and graduate certificates

Admission requirements for the various graduate diplomas and graduate certificates are normally a Bachelor degree in the appropriate discipline or an equivalent qualification supported by the completion of studies viewed as relevant by the Faculty. In some cases relevant experience may be required. In some instances the admission requirements for a Graduate certificate may be met by appropriate work experience or other forms of prior learning.

Masters degrees

Coursework Masters degrees usually require a three-year Bachelor degree as an entry requirement. Check the relevant Faculty for further information.

Overseas qualifications and English proficiency

If you have undertaken your studies in an overseas country you may have to provide proof of proficiency in English. If you have to provide proof of English proficiency and fail to do so, you will not be considered at all for the

SPECIAL/ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

You may have to submit additional material as part of your application depending on which course/s you apply for. Check UAC's postgraduate website at www.uac.edu.au/postgraduate to see whether special requirements apply.

Submit your material by the date specified in the relevant course description at www.uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search/

Application closing dates

Enrolment/intake dates

Enrolment dates will be advised in the enrolment pack if you are successful.

ENROLMENT

Acceptance of offer

Successful applicants will have their enrolment information pack mailed to them and will be required to attend an enrolment session as specified in the pack.

Advanced standing/academic credit

Students seeking status/exemption on the basis of studies completed at another institution must complete an Application for Credit form and provide an official transcript of the studies undertaken elsewhere, together with an extract of the course descriptions from the relevant institution handbook or equivalent. This should be submitted to the relevant Faculty/department as soon as possible after a place is offered.

Deferment

It may be possible to postpone your commencement of a postgraduate program after you have received an offer. Deferment requests will be handled directly by the University of Sydney, not UAC. Apply in writing to the relevant Faculty/department as soon as possible.

DIRECT APPLICATIONS

The majority of the University's postgraduate coursework courses are not offered through UAC. Postgraduate research programs and Bachelor honours programs are also not offered through UAC.
