Central city location

The University of Technology, Sydney (UTS) city campus is in the heart of Sydney, a five-minute walk from Central Station, Sydney's major train and bus station. The University is located within the creative industries' 'inner city triangle', the location of 39 per cent of Australia's creative industries head offices and 70 per cent of its major international creative IT companies. The smaller Kuring-gai campus is located in Lindfield, on Sydney's North Shore, to which the UTS bus service provides transport.

Strong relationships with the professions

UTS maintains strong relationships with local industry and the professions by including professional representatives on Faculty academic advisory committees, hosting creative industries events such as the UTS Sydney International Animation, Smart Light and Design festivals, and facilitating linkages through the University's Creative Industries Innovation Centre.

Practice-orientated education

UTS has built a strong reputation as a progressive, egalitarian university with a distinctive focus on practice-oriented learning, teaching, and applied research for the twenty-first century. As a student you will benefit from learning environments that are integrated to professional practice and inspired by research.

As a leading practice-based university, UTS courses are practical as well as academically rigorous. Our course content is regularly checked by industry advisory committees to make sure that what you are learning is up-to-date and relevant. Many academic staff are internationally recognised in their fields and are actively involved with their industries and professions.

Student support services

We understand the reality of balancing work, family commitments and study. Many of our courses can be studied part-time or fast-tracked by doing extra subjects in a summer semester. Comprehensive professional services are provided to support every aspect of your student life, including housing, health, special needs, careers, financial assistance, learning skills, counselling and IT support.

Diversity of students

In 2010, over 20,500 students, including 9,300 postgraduate course work students, were enrolled at UTS, onshore and outside Australia. The large majority, were enrolled at the city campus.

One of our key strengths is the social and cultural diversity of our students (7,000 international students from 115 countries), staff and partners in the professions and the community, as well as our strong international profile. This diversity has created a vibrant and rich learning environment that prepares graduates for the workplace of today and the future.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The minimum educational requirement for entry to most postgraduate courses is a completed Bachelor degree. Entry requirements vary between courses – some courses have additional selection requirements for details visit www.uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search/

Applicants with substantial relevant work experience and no Bachelor degree may be considered for entry to some Graduate certificate programs. You can obtain information about the entry requirements for a specific course by calling 1300 275 887 or from the relevant Faculty website.

Overseas qualifications and English proficiency

If you have undertaken your studies in an overseas country you may have to provide proof of proficiency in English. Refer to the English language proficiency table at www.uac.edu.au/postgraduate/faq/elp.shtml for information about tests and qualifications accepted by the University as proof of proficiency in English.

ADDITIONAL APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

You may have to complete either a personal statement, a curriculum vitae (CV) or questionnaire or submit a portfolio as part of the application process. Check UAC's postgraduate website at www.uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search/ to see whether additional application requirements apply.

Your application may not be considered if you fail to meet the additional application requirements specified for the courses listed on UAC's postgraduate website.

When do you have to submit your additional material?

You must submit your additional material at the same time that an application is submitted to UAC. If you delay the submission of your additional material your application may not be considered.

TYPES OF PROGRAMS AVAILABLE

UTS offers approximately 400 Masters by Coursework, Postgraduate diploma, and Postgraduate certificate courses throughout the year.

A number of the University's postgraduate coursework programs are offered through UAC, visit UAC's postgraduate website at www.uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search/ for details. All other postgraduate coursework programs (including courses offered by UTS Business School) and all postgraduate research programs are available through direct application to the University.

It is important that you distinguish between those courses for which you are required to apply through UAC (refer to www.uac.edu.au/postgraduate/ for details) and those for which you must apply directly to UTS.

ENROLMENT

Successful applicants will receive an offer notification from UAC. Offers are made progressively as decisions are provided by the relevant faculties.

Successful applicants must go to www.start.uts.edu.au for offer acceptance and enrolment.

Deferment

Deferment in postgraduate coursework programs at UTS is not permitted as an automatic entitlement. If you receive an offer in Intake 1 (Summer semester) or 2 (Autumn semester) in 2012 and you are unable to accept the offer for that semester, you can carry forward your application for consideration in a later semester in 2012 by submitting a change of preference online through UAC. (You must submit a new application if you want to be considered in 2013.)

FEES AND CHARGES

Study costs are dependent on whether students are enrolled in a Commonwealth-supported course or a fee-paying course.

Most postgraduate courses are fee-paying and students are required to pay tuition fees directly to the University. However, a small number of courses available offer Commonwealth-supported places.

UAC's postgraduate website at www.uac.edu.au/postgraduate/course-search/ includes details of the annual tuition fees based on enrolment in a full-time load in 2012. Check the UTS website at www.uts.edu.au for more information on 2012 fees and other charges. Tuition fees at UTS are calculated per credit point and charged on a per semester basis. A typical postgraduate subject at UTS is worth six credit points.

Eligible, local fee-paying students enrolled in postgraduate coursework may have access to the Higher Education Loan Program (FEE-HELP). FEE-HELP provides students with a loan of up to \$89,706 (2012 limit) to cover their tuition fees. Further info can be found at www.goingtouni.gov.au

Payment of a student services fee (of up to approximately \$250) may become compulsory from 2012.
