ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

In order to be admitted as a candidate for a Bachelor degree at Macquarie University you need to satisfy the general requirements listed in one of the following categories and be selected for enrolment in competition with other applicants.

1 Australian secondary studies

Selection will be based on ATAR or equivalent obtained from an Australian Year 12 in 2011 or earlier (unless you have undertaken tertiary study including TAFE). Eligibility may be granted to those with examination qualifications at a level considered by the University to be of an equivalent standard.

2 Australian tertiary studies

If you have ever undertaken tertiary studies you will be considered for selection on your overall record of academic merit – that is, both secondary and tertiary study. Applicants with tertiary studies, but who have not completed a Year 12 qualification, will be considered for selection on the basis of their tertiary rank.

Former Macquarie students applying to return to the same undergraduate degree after an absence must apply directly to Macquarie University (www.studentadmin.mq.edu.au/readmission/index.html) if they have not studied at another tertiary institution, including TAFE, or completed further secondary studies during their absence. If you have completed further secondary studies or attempted tertiary studies, including TAFE, since you were last enrolled at Macquarie you must apply through UAC.

3 Overseas qualifications

Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia with overseas qualifications must provide correctly-verified documentation with their application. If you apply on the basis of overseas qualifications you may be required to sit for an English language proficiency test. For requirements read table 5 in the *UAC 2012 Guide* or check UAC's website.

4 Alternative entry

Some of the educational qualifications accepted by Macquarie for selection purposes include:

- Limited ATAR
- completion of a Macquarie University non-award program of 12 or more credit points with an overall minimum grade point average of 2.0
- completion of 10 units of the Tertiary Preparation Certificate (TPC) at a TAFE college.
- Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT).

ENROLMENT

Acceptance of offer and enrolment

If your application is successful, you will receive information with your offer which directs you to the Macquarie enrolment web page, where the procedure for accepting online and enrolling at Macquarie will be explained.

If you are offered a place in a distance education course you are not required to attend the University and will be sent enrolment information by mail. Contact the Centre for Open Education for further information at coe@mq.edu.au

Advanced standing/academic credit

If you are seeking credit for previous tertiary studies you will need to complete a Request for Credit for Previous Studies (CPS) form (www.studentadmin.mq.edu.au/undergrad/credit.html). This form together with full official transcripts (not result slips) of your previous tertiary studies should be submitted to the University as soon as possible to be assessed before enrolment.

Fees and charges

All students must pay student contributions for a Commonwealth-supported place – read section 7 in the *UAC 2012 Guide*.

STUDENT AND CAMPUS SERVICES

Macquarie provides a comprehensive range of services and facilities for students. These include four childcare centres on campus; three on-campus accommodation complexes; a career development centre; a counselling and health service; sports and recreation organisations; maths support through the Numeracy Centre; and U@MQ (the student union), which offers food outlets, catering services and entertainment. The University has exchange agreements with universities around the world, giving students ample opportunities to study abroad.

A railway station at Macquarie University connects the University with Epping, Chatswood and the City via the Northern Line.
