## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be offered admission in a course at the University you must meet the general requirements listed in one of the categories set out below, satisfy English language requirements, and be selected in competition with other eligible applicants from a particular category. For further information call UC on 1300 301 727.

### 1 Australian secondary studies

#### 2011 and previous Australian Year 12 students

If you are a 2011 Australian Year 12 student, you will be considered for admission on the basis of your ATAR or equivalent. If you have previously completed an ACT Year 12 Tertiary Package, NSW HSC, interstate equivalent or Leaving Certificate (after 1960), you will be considered for admission on the basis of your ATAR or equivalent. If you have attempted other studies since then, these will also be taken into account in the assessment of your application.

### 2 Australian tertiary studies

If you achieved reasonable results in a degree course at any Australian university or in any nationally accredited course, you will be considered for admission on the basis of the qualification scoring the highest rank.

**Exclusion:** If you have previously been excluded from a tertiary institution, you must provide UC with a detailed supporting statement outlining the reasons for exclusion and why you believe you would be more successful in future studies.

#### Previous University of Canberra students

**Students applying to return after an absence:** If you were enrolled at UC (or the Canberra College of Advanced Education) in previous years, but withdrew from the course, you must apply to return to this University through UAC.

### 3 Overseas qualifications

Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia with overseas qualifications must contact the UC Admissions Office to discuss eligibility for admission before applying through UAC.

If you have secondary or tertiary qualifications from countries where English is not the standard language of instruction, you must provide evidence of English proficiency. For requirements read table 5 in the *UAC 2012 Guide* or check UAC's website.

## 4 Alternative entry

If you were 21 years of age or older on 1 March 2012, and you do not have either an acceptable Australian Year 12 or other qualification, you may seek admission to UC on the basis of your performance in one or more of the programs listed below.

Before choosing an alternative entry program, you should seek guidance from the UC Admissions Office.

- **University preparation schemes available through the University of Canberra College (UCC)** – UC-PREP, UC-START and UC-CONNECT – for further information call UCC (02) 6201 5709 or visit [www.canberra.edu.au/college/](http://www.canberra.edu.au/college/)
- **Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT)** – to register to sit STAT for 2012 mid-year admissions download a registration form and information leaflet from UAC's website at [www.uac.edu.au/stat/](http://www.uac.edu.au/stat/)
- **Tertiary preparation courses** – conducted by a university, Australian TAFE institution or the Canberra Institute of Technology (CIT).
- **Limited ATAR/Abridged Year 12 programs** – for further information read section 8.8 in the *UAC 2012 Guide*.
- **Employment experience** – does not need to be within the same field as the course/s for which you have applied.

## SPECIAL CONSIDERATION

In a very limited number of circumstances you may be eligible for special consideration by the University when you are not eligible to apply under the EAS or as an Elite Athlete. In this case, apply for admission through UAC, and then document your case for special consideration and forward it directly to UC's Admissions Office.

## ENROLMENT

### Acceptance of offer

Successful applicants can accept their offer of a place online. Instructions will be sent with letters of offer.

### Academic credit

You may be granted credit if you have undertaken previous Australian or other tertiary studies. Bring all relevant documentation to your course enrolment advisory session. For further information call Student Administration on 1300 301 727.

### Deferment of offer

You cannot defer an offer made in mid-year.

### Fees and charges

All students must pay student contributions for a Commonwealth-supported place – read section 7 in the *UAC 2012 Guide*.
