ABOUT

UNSW Canberra at the Australian Defence Force Academy (ADFA) is the Canberra based campus of UNSW Sydney (The University of New South Wales). ADFA is a unique partnership between the Australian Defence Force (ADF) and UNSW Sydney, providing training and education for future leaders of the Navy, Army and Air Force.

At UNSW Canberra at ADFA, all undergraduate students must be either:

- trainee officers employed by the ADF as either midshipmen of the Royal Australian Navy, or officer cadets of the Australian Regular Army or Royal Australian Air Force
- mature-age officer applicants who are Defence Force personnel applying for entry through service commissioning schemes
- recipients of the Defence Civilian Undergraduate Sponsorship (DCUS). These students are selected by the Defence Organisation and their university fees are Defence-sponsored. The DCUS is available for selection into B Engineering (Aeronautical, Civil, Electrical or Mechanical) and B Computing and Cyber Securing programs
- non-Defence students applying for admission to B Engineering (Honours) (Aeronautical, Civil, Electrical, or Mechanical) or dual B Engineering (Honours) (Aeronautical, Civil, Electrical, or Mechanical)/B Science.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission requirements for undergraduate courses at UNSW Canberra are similar to those applicable to other UNSW courses – refer to 'Admission requirements' at the beginning of UNSW Sydney's entry.

Assumed knowledge

A table listing the specific Year 12 subjects for each state and territory that currently satisfy the UNSW Canberra at ADFA assumed knowledge requirements can be found at unsw.adfa.edu.au/study/undergraduate/assumed-knowledge.

Where a specific degree lists a Year 12 subject as assumed knowledge, the table will enable you to determine which Year 12 subject this equates to in your state or territory. Requirements are expressed as minimum where there is more than one level. For example, to satisfy the mathematics requirement, a NSW student would have to complete at least Mathematics, while a Queensland student would have to complete at least Mathematics B.

While the assumed knowledge is the minimum requirement, Year 12 students are recommended to undertake higher levels of these subjects.

Offers made to applicants who have an ATAR below the published cut-off

UNSW has a number of alternative pathways for admission, which may allow 2017 NSW and ACT Year 12 applicants to receive an offer to a course even though they have an ATAR below the published cut-off. Refer to section 5.5 in Part 1 'Special entry schemes'.

Defence Force recruiting process

Trainee officers

Trainee officers for ADFA must complete the Defence Force Recruiting process and be selected by one of the three armed services of the Australian Defence Force. Applicants must apply online at defencejobs.gov.au/education/adfa or by telephone on 13 19 01. In addition, applicants must meet the academic requirements to study at UNSW Canberra and apply online through UAC.

Current serving Defence members

UNSW Canberra accepts applications from mature-age officer applicants who are Defence Force personnel applying for entry through service commissioning schemes. In addition, applicants must meet the academic requirements to study at UNSW Canberra and apply online through UAC.

Defence Civilian Undergraduate Sponsorship

The Department of Defence offers the Defence Civilian Undergraduate Sponsorship (DCUS) to non-Defence students who wish to pursue a degree through UNSW Canberra at ADFA. Applicants must apply online at defence.gov.au/dmo/careers/studentsandgraduates/undergraduatesponsorship by September 2017. In addition, applicants must meet the academic requirements to study at UNSW Canberra and apply online through UAC.

Non-Defence applicants

UNSW Canberra has opened enrolment in its undergraduate engineering programs to non-Defence students. Non-Defence applicants must submit a direct application to UNSW Canberra at unsw.adfa.edu.au/apply by **Sunday 3 December 2017**. In addition, applicants must meet the academic requirements to study at UNSW Canberra and apply online through UAC.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATION

Educational disadvantage may be given consideration under the UNSW ACCESS Scheme or Special Consideration for Applicants with Tertiary Studies (SCATS) in the academic selection process for entry to UNSW Canberra. Refer to 'Admission requirements' at the beginning of UNSW Sydney's entry and section 5.5 in Part 1 'Special entry schemes'.

ENROLMENT

Acceptance of offer

You will receive details of acceptance and enrolment procedures with your UAC offer. Failure to follow the outlined procedures will result in your offer lapsing. Full details regarding acceptance and enrolment will be available from October on UNSW's website at gettingstarted.unsw.edu.au.

Advanced standing/academic credit

If you have already completed some tertiary study, you may be entitled to credit for relevant subjects. UNSW Canberra does not determine credit transfer until an offer of admission has been made and accepted. For more information, visit unsw.adfa.edu.au/study/undergraduate.

Deferment of offer

May be granted by Defence Force Recruiting in special circumstances.

Fees and charges

Trainee officers: As members of the Australian Defence Force, trainee officers are exempt from Commonwealth student contributions and the student services and amenities fee.

Non-Defence and DCUS students: For 2018 fee information, visit student.unsw.edu.au/fees.

Non-Defence students must pay a student contribution for a Commonwealth-supported place (CSP); read section 7.2 in Part 1. In addition, all non-Defence must pay a student services and amenities fee each semester. For further details, visit student.unsw.edu.au/ssaf.
