AUSTRALIAN 2009 YEAR 12 RESULTS CONVERSION TABLE

In June 2009 the Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) replaced the Universities Admission Index (UAI) in NSW and the ACT. All states and territories (except Queensland) will introduce the name ATAR during 2009 and 2010.

The aim of this table is to provide interstate 2009 Year 12 applicants with information about the conversion of their results across Australia.

As the table shows, although given different names, the measures of overall achievement in most states and territories are considered to be equivalent. So an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) of 80.00 in the ACT and NSW is exactly the same as an Equivalent National Tertiary Entrance Rank (ENTER) of 80.00 in Victoria = a Tertiary Entrance Rank (TER) of 80.00 in the Northern Territory, South Australia, Tasmania and Western Australia.

This means that, for example, 2009 Year 12 students in NSW who are applying to institutions in Victoria do not have to convert their results.

The table also shows how these ranks equate to an Overall Position in Queensland.
