

Early indication of support needs for UAC applicants with disabilities

Universities can provide services and assessment adjustments for students who have disabilities and ongoing illnesses which have an impact on their studies. Universities use the term 'disability' to include a wide range of illnesses as well as physical, sensory, learning and psychiatric disabilities.

The aim of this questionnaire is to help facilitate contact between you and the disability support staff at the institutions to which you are applying, and to help those staff members to plan for next year.

If you have a disability which will have a significant impact on your studies, we strongly encourage you to contact the disability support staff at the institutions to which you have applied as soon as possible.

While the support services and physical access differ from institution to institution, the services generally offered include: note takers, personal readers, examination provisions, assistance in the library, learning assistance, alternative assessment methods, and provision of academic material in alternative formats. Some institutions may provide parking for holders of RTA mobility access permits.

Information you give us on the questionnaire will ONLY be passed on to institution staff that are responsible for arranging services for students with disabilities. If you receive an offer of admission your completed questionnaire will be mailed directly to the disability support staff member at that institution.

Collection of personal information
