Main Round university offers released on Wednesday night

MORE than 76 000 university applicants can discover on Wednesday night if they have received an offer to study at a university in NSW or the ACT this year when Main Round offers are released by the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC).

Eager applicants can check from **9pm** (Sydney time) on Wednesday night whether they have been made an offer in one of two ways:

- by visiting UAC's website at www.uac.edu.au; or
- by calling the UAC InfoLine on 1900 957 500.

For those applicants who would rather wait to see it in writing, offers will also be available as follows:

- all applicants will receive a letter in the mail from UAC from Thursday 18 January 2007; and
- a complete list of applicants who have been made an offer will be published on Thursday 18 January 2007 in *The Sydney Morning Herald* and *The Daily Telegraph*, with local subsets in *The Canberra Times* and *The Newcastle Herald*.

The newspapers will also publish the minimum UAI needed by applicants being selected on the basis of their 2006 Australian Year 12 results for entry into each course, as well as details of any courses that still have vacancies.

Last year 56 131 offers were made in the Main Round.

For those who miss out on a Main Round offer, further offers will be made in the Late Round. Applicants can change their preferences for consideration in the Late Round from 9pm on Wednesday 17 January until midnight on Monday 22 January 2007 via UAC's website at www.uac.edu.au, or by calling the UAC InfoLine on 1900 957 500.

Late Round offers will be released at 9pm on Wednesday 31 January 2007. Last year, 6 665 offers were made in the Late Round.

Anyone who has not submitted an application through UAC for admission to a course this year can do so until Thursday 1 February 2007 (fees and conditions apply). Information is available on UAC's website and in the *UAC 2007 Guide*.
