

UAC offers to Year 12 students



There are three main UAC offer rounds for Year 12 students; they take place in November, December and January. This is a brief guide to what you can expect in each round and what to do when you get an offer.

For every offer round, make sure you have your course preferences in order. Place the course you most want to do at number 1.

Have you applied directly to a uni as well? Make the most of both applications and choose different preferences in each. Check with the uni as to how and when it will make its direct offers.

12 Nov 2020

November Round 1

- First offers made to Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS) applicants.
- You can receive:
 - one unconditional SRS offer (no conditions attached, nothing more for you to do but accept it)
 - multiple conditional SRS offers (conditions attached – usually a minimum ATAR required – and you must leave them in your list of course preferences). Conditional offers will be converted to unconditional offers in December Round 2 on 23 December 2020.

Confirm the order of your course preferences by midnight 8 November 2020.



23 Dec 2020

December Round 2

- First offers made based on your ATAR.
- Offers made to Year 12 students whose results are available in time (primarily NSW HSC and ACT Year 12 students).
- Other Australian Year 12 students whose results are not available in time (and IB students if your results are delivered later than planned) will not be disadvantaged: your results will be considered in January Round 1 and January Round 2.
- SRS conditional offer converted to unconditional offer if you have met the specified requirements.
- **You can receive only one offer.** It will be unconditional.



Confirm the order of your course preferences by midnight 19 December 2020.

- All institutions, except the Australian National University and Charles Darwin University, will make offers in this round. However, offers will not be made to the following courses until January Round 1:

Be careful if you decide to remove any of the courses listed above from your preference list, as some institutions may require you to keep the course as a preference until offers are made.

8 Jan 2021

January Round 1

- All institutions, except Charles Darwin University, will make offers to all courses in this round.
- Charles Darwin University will wait until January Round 2 to make offers to the following courses: Clinical Sciences, Health Science double degrees, Midwifery, Nursing.
- Required selection ranks may be higher or lower than – or the same as – the ranks required to get an offer in December Round 2.

- **You can receive only one offer.** It will be unconditional.
