

UAC key dates

under review

On Friday 10 September a revised timetable for NSW HSC examinations and results was released.

As a consequence, **the following UAC dates will change:**

- ATARs for NSW and ACT Year 12 students will now be released at 9am on Thursday 20 January 2022.
- January Round 2 will now be the first ATAR-based offer round. The deadline for changing preferences for January Round 2 will be midnight on Friday 21 January 2022.
- January Round 2 offers will be released at 7.30am on Wednesday 26 January 2022.
- Educational Access Scheme applications must be completed by Friday 17 December to be considered in January Round 2 offers and to receive an eligibility letter on Friday 21 January 2022.

Other UAC dates are under review by UAC and institutions and will be confirmed as soon as possible.

Research available courses

There are over 2,000 courses available for 2022 admissions via UAC. You can read descriptions of these courses on the UAC website: check the admission requirements and ATAR information. Once you've found your favourite courses, research pathways and alternatives so that you have a back-up plan. Take note of important dates in the application process.

Get your USI

Your Unique Student Identifier is your government-issued student reference number that you will keep with you for life. You need it to enrol at an institution and receive Commonwealth financial assistance, including HECS-HELP and FEE-HELP. You may already have one if you've undertaken vocational education or training. You can create a USI – or check if you have one – at usi.gov.au.

Keep your UAC PIN safe

You need your UAC Personal Identification Number to:

- apply for tertiary study through UAC
- access your ATAR.

If you're a 2021 NSW/ACT HSC student, your four-digit UAC PIN was emailed to the address you registered with the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA). Note that your UAC PIN is different to your NESA PIN.

For all other applicants, your UAC PIN is the first four digits of your date of birth; for example, if your birthday is 17 May, your UAC PIN is 1705.

To protect your privacy, it's a good idea to change your UAC PIN once you've submitted your application. And, of course, keep your UAC PIN in a secure place. For more information, visit uac.edu.au/pin.

Apply for uni through UAC

Go to UAC's website to apply. You can select up to five course preferences. Even if you're not sure what you want to study, apply now and change your preferences later. We recommend you apply before midnight on **30 September** to avoid an increase in the processing charge.

Remember to make a note of your application number. You'll need this number and your UAC PIN to log back in to your application to change your preferences.

Provide a current email

You'll need to provide a current email address when you apply so that UAC can let you know about the progress of your application. We recommend you log in regularly to check for messages.

Check your details are correct

The personal details you provided to NESA – including your first, middle and last name – must match your passport or birth certificate. Inform your school of any changes to your name so that this information will be transferred to your UAC application.

Apply for schemes and scholarships

Schools Recommendation Scheme

The Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS) gives you an opportunity to receive an early offer by being assessed on criteria other than, or in addition to, the ATAR. These criteria include school recommendations and senior secondary studies.

SRS applications close at midnight on **19 September 2021**. After this date, you cannot access or modify your SRS application. [Download the SRS booklet.](#)

Educational Access Scheme

The Educational Access Scheme (EAS) can help you gain admission to tertiary study if you've experienced long-term educational disadvantage. Apply for EAS as part of your application for uni.

We recommend you apply by **22 November 2021** so that you can be assessed in time for the main Year 12 offer rounds. [Download the EAS booklet.](#)

Equity Scholarships

Equity Scholarships help the most financially disadvantaged students with the costs associated with higher education.
